PART A: CHOICE ITEMS

ACTIVITY 1

Listen to items 1a-4a and choose the best option (A-F) as in the example. There is one option that you do not need.

Example: In the last three years, more than one million things have been lost on London Transport. This is the most common thing that we find – thousands and thousands are forgotten by passengers every year. Of course, it rains so much here in London it's not surprising.

- 1a. But we also find dozens of pairs of these, every year – they're some of the most common things that people leave on trains and buses. Sometimes they are really expensive ones and, of course, it's a disaster for some people who can't see without them.
- 2a. And I remember once we had a call from a woman who was playing in a concert that evening, and she'd forgotten her instrument on the train. It was a really expensive one, worth about 100,000 euros. She'd been playing with it for 20 years! Luckily, we managed to find it for her in time for the concert.
- 3a. And we often find really surprising things – like this. There was a man last week who'd been on his way to buy a very expensive ring for his girlfriend, and he had everything in cash. And then forgot it on the train! But he was really lucky because someone handed it in. So, there are some good people around!
- 4a. And we also find really nice household items as well – this was found last week. It's antique, it still keeps perfect time. I was looking to buy one like this for my dining room wall, so if no-one claims it, I'm going to make an offer to buy it.

ACTIVITY 2

Read items 5a-7a, listen and choose the best answer (A, B, or C) for each item.

When we think of diamonds, we think of love and the ultimate romantic gift. They are the hardest of stones, and the word diamond originates from the Greek word “ἀδάμας (adámas), meaning strong and not easily broken. From that comes the idea that the diamond reflects the undying flame of love.

If you ask most people why diamonds are so expensive, they would probably reply that it's because they are so rare, and that only a few can be found. But actually, nothing could be further from the truth! There are enough diamonds in the world to fill a coffee cup for every person on this planet! The real reason they're so expensive is because the companies that produce them want to keep the prices high by producing only a small number of them. And something else that people don't know is why we use the word ‘carat’ when describing them – you know, Kim Kardashian has a 15-carat diamond”. Well, the carat describes the weight of the diamond. Its name comes from the carob seed, a seed from the carob tree. These small seeds were used by the first diamond traders to weigh the diamonds, and so... *[fade]*

ACTIVITY 1

Listen and fill in items 1b-5b with the right word, as in the example.
